## WORLD ZOONOSES DAY CELEBRATED

Indian Veterinary Association with the co-operation of Animal Husbandry Department celebrated July 6th as World Zoonoses Day. State level inauguration and scientific seminar were held at Kanakakkunnu palace, Trivandrum on 6th July2001. Hon. minister



for Animal Husbandry, Govt. of Kerala Smt. K.R. Gouriamma inaugurated the function. Minister for Health Sri. P. Sankaran was the guest of hon-

our. Around 200 Veterinarians and 50 medical officers from various districts attended the function.

In the inaugural speech, minister for Animal Husbandry Smt. K. R. Gouriamma emphasised the need for controlling zoonotic diseases like leptospirosis and rabies in the state. A multi disciplinary approach with the co-operation of Departments of Animal Husbandry, Agriculture and Health services are needed in the control of epidemics. She congratulated the organisers for celebrating the World Zoonoses Day with the involvement of Health department.

In his address, minister for health, Sri. P. Sankaran assured all helps to Animal Husbandry Department in controlling the major epidemics



like leptospirosis. With the active involvement of both Departments effective research studies can be under taken, he added. Indian Veterinary Association state president Dr. Rabekka Thomas presided over the function. She demanded urgent measures from the government to control major zoonotic diseases and added that action has to be taken against unscientific slaughterhouses in the state. Director of Health services Dr. V.K.Rajan released the JIVA special issue on

level is maintained throughout the susceptible age.


Recently, technology has been developed to deliver live vaccines into eggs during incubation i.e. at 18 days of incubation. The eggs go on to hatch and the vaccine virus is released when the chicks are about 7 days of age.

### Antibody Profiling

Monitoring of antibody levels in chicks and breeder flocks can aid in determining the proper time of vaccination and to assess effectiveness of vaccination. However this do not appear to be the answer due to the prevailing farming conditions in India

tive in controlling IBDV infection and the only effect of treatment with antibiotics and vitamin supplements will be to assist the bird's resistance to secondary infection.

#### Conclusion

A universal control programme can not be offered because of the variability in maternal immunity, nature of virus and management conditions that exists. Some unfortunate 'breakdowns' in vaccinations do occur due to several factors discussed earlier. However, recent fundamental changes in poultry farming practices and newer trends in disease control measures give a reasonable hope that the disease will be effectively controlled.
