

The last four antibiotics-Monensin, Salinomycin, Avilamycin, Flavo phospholipol can no longer be used as feed additives to improve growth & feed efficiency of livestock & poultry.

The World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) has been informed that a cat infected with the H5N1 virus has been found in the island of Rugen in Germany according to an OIE reference laboratory for avian influenza. This is not the first time that felines have been naturally infected with the H5N1 virus. An episode occurred in 2004 in a zoo in Bangkok where more then 40 tigers died and many others were culled due to the infection. On that occasion, investigations showed that the tigers were fed entire carcasses of chickens most likely infected with H5N1. The tigers may have been infected by either inhalation of large amounts of virus that could have been present on the surface/feathers of the poultry carcasses (faecal contamination) or via ingestion of the entire carcasses, including intestines and faeces. Also other "natural" fatal cases of H5N1 have been reported in domestic cats in Asia. Cats are known to be susceptible to the H5N1 virus. Under experimental conditions cat-to-cat transmission of H5N1 virus has also been demonstrated.

Combined executive was held on 12th March 2006, at Thrissur, to discuss the pay commission issue and the conduct of Annual Vets convention 2006. It has been decided to go in for a series of protests and to explore legal option based on consultation. Apart from this, efforts will be taken to counter and convince the Government and other officials, all the substandard and irrelevant findings of the pay commission.

Representations were given to Minister for AH, Director of AH, Chief Secretary and Chief Minister to protest the defamatory statements made by the 8th pay commission and for denying the eligible parity as given by Justice Pandian Commission.

Representation was given to the Director of Animal Husbandry to postpone the proposed ADCP drop out vaccination from 2nd week of March to a later month.

Representation was given to the Chief Electoral Officer to exempt veterinarians working in veterinary hospitals and laboratories from election duty and desists from allotting veterinary hospitals as election booth. The Chief Electoral Officer gave assurance in this regard to exempt veterinarians except in the few districts were there is a shortage of staff. Fax messages were also sent to District Collectors regarding this.

The IVA President, and the former President of IVA participated in the meeting to discuss formation of Veterinary University at Hotel Mascot, Thiruvana nthapuram on 17th March 2006.

KSPDC

A Seminar on Avian Influenza vs food safety was held on 11th March 2006 at Trivandrum to create awareness among the public regarding food safety in the wake of Birdflu threat. Dr. Jalaludheen Associate Professor (Poultry) COVAS, Mannuthy handled the session, President IVA and Director AH addressed the gathering.

TIGER CENSUS

The census of tiger in the State was carried out from the 20th to 27th of Feb. 2006. Habitat for tigers include Parambiculam, Chimmony, Peechi-Vazhani, Neyyar, Peppara, Wayanad and the Aralam Wild life Sanctuaries, the Silent Valley & Eravikulam National Parks and the Periyar Tiger Reserves. Census is based on both direct sightings and indirect signs. Indirect signs include pugmarks, faecal pellets, scratch marks, urine scents and tiger calls. Dr. Easwaran, Forest Veterinary Officer, is of the view that the presence of prey species would also serve as an input for the census. Camera trapping is also made use of as a technique.
