
DEPARTMENT GOES WIRELESS

A 24 hour control room is working at ADCP headquarters, Thiruvananthapuram to monitor the emergency situations, animal movement, disease outbreaks and disease control activities. The control room is named SADEC (State Animal Disease Emergency Control - Ph: 0471-3956288) and is



manned by an Assistant Director, two Veterinary surgeons, two Livestock Inspectors and Attendants. For effective networking and co-ordination of this control centre, check post, biological institute, chief disease investigation office, and directorate of animal husbandry, a wireless network system has been installed. Main base station is in Directorate of AH, extensions available in CDIO, Check post Parassala, SADEC, Director of AH, Additional Director (AH) and Joint Director, ADCP. Handsets are available with Director of AH, Additional Director (AH) and Joint Director, ADCP and base units with Directorate of AH, CDIO, Check post Parassala and SADEC being the pilot project, the system is installed in Thiruvananthapuram district and will be extended to other districts in a phased manner says Dr. V. Brahmanandan, Joint Director of ADCP. The reports of all the 17 check post, disease investigation laboratories and district offices will be brought under this network so that outbreak reporting, disease diagnosis, disease control and animal movement will be effectively monitored at all levels at the same time, he added. In the present scenario all the details regarding Avian Flu received at SADEC and CDIO is being simultaneously communicated to the Director of Animal Husbandry, Additional Director (AH) and Joint Director, ADCP through wireless network.



Some of the conditions has been revised and given below
